



**COVID-19 RESTRICTED CLUB COMPETITION
SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS V1** (1 January 2021)

IMPORTANT NOTE

These Supplementary Regulations can only be used for Club Karting Competition at an Affiliated Karting Club in strict accordance with the requirements of all Federal and State Government COVID-19 mass gathering Orders and Directions. The Club must have completed and submitted to their SKA, their COVIDSafe Action Plan for all facilities.

COVID-19 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND VOLUNTARY ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

By entering or participating in this Karting activity/event, all Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons acknowledge that, even with rigorous capacity and control measures that Karting Australia requires the Organising Club to put in place at all Karting Australia sanctioned Karting activities/events, there remains an unquantifiable risk of transmission of viral illness including COVID-19 at a Karting activity/event at this time and you have considered that risk and your own personal circumstances, including any health condition or vulnerability that you may have or that of persons whom you will be in close contact with following your attendance at a Karting activity/event. You acknowledge that, for a small number of people, COVID-19 has very serious health consequences. 3. SPECIFIC COVID-19 RESTRICTION AND MITIGATION REQUIREMENTS

THE CLUB HAS COMPLETED A COVIDSafe ACTION PLAN	
The Plan has been submitted to Karting SA and where required by law, to the relevant State Government Department. All actions identified as being required to be done to create a COVIDSafe Event and Club facility must be carried out prior to and during the Event.	
1.	PERMITTED AND NON-PERMITTED PERSONS
1.1.	No person who has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (this includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, lack of smell or fatigue) is permitted to attend the Circuit or participate in the Event.
1.2.	Any person who starts to feel unwell or to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 during the Event must immediately avoid contact with all persons at the Circuit and MUST IMMEDIATELY LEAVE the Circuit.
1.3.	<p>Note – The Organising Club must ensure that the maximum number of people (the combined total of Essential Personnel and Permitted Persons) permitted to gather in total at an Event and in groups in accordance with State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations is not exceeded at any time prior to or during the Event.</p> <p>Essential Karting Personnel is defined as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Club President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary; and • COVIDSafe Officer • Essential Officials identified in Section 1.8 of these Regulations • First Aid Attendant; and • Administration and Access Control Attendant/s • Event Operations staff (includes but is not limited to canteen staff, cleaners etc).
1.4.	<p>Permitted Persons</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Licensed Driver (Driver) who has booked their entry in the Event plus a maximum of Unlimited other people per kart who must be either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The Parent, Legal Guardian, or family member of the Driver; or ○ The Participant License Holder for the Driver; or ○ A Mechanic whose sole task it is, is to prepare, adjust, repair the kart as may be required; • A Person who is approved by the Club to supply karting components and provide specialised karting service to any Permitted Persons in attendance at the Activity.
1.5.	<p>Non-Permitted Persons</p> <p>SPECTATORS are permitted to be in attendance.</p>
2.	<p>Note – The number chosen in 2.1 must not exceed the maximum number of people permitted to gather under State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations.</p> <p>SOCIAL DISTANCING AND DENSITY REQUIRMENTS</p>
2.1.	Government prescribed Social Distancing measures must always be observed.

2.2.	The use by Permitted Persons of any indoor facilities is strictly limited by the Density Quotient of the room as included in the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan.
2.3.	Food service provided at the Event must fully comply with all State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hand Hygiene must be available at all food service outlets. • Regular cleaning in accordance with the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan MUST be carried out throughout the Event.
3.	KARTING AUSTRALIA COVID-19 DECLARATION
3.1	<p>Under NO circumstances is ANYONE who has been overseas, or in a declared COVID-19 hotspot, in the previous 14 days or been in contact with a person who is known to be COVID-19 positive, permitted to attend the Circuit.</p> <p>All Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons MUST complete and submit the Karting Australia COVID-19 Declaration, or the compulsory State Government issued QR Code Check-In (delete which is not relevant) before the commencement time of the Event.</p>
4.	HYGIENE FACILITIES - TOILET/WASHROOM FACILITIES and HAND SANITISER
4.1	The Club is required to provide facilities to ensure general and sensible hygiene practices are maintained.
4.2	Toilet and washroom facilities at the Circuit must be open and available for use.
4.3	<p>Washroom facilities must be properly equipped with liquid soap, running water and either air hand driers or paper towels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The toilets and washroom facilities must be cleaned at least once during the day or as otherwise required in accordance with the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan
4.4	It is strongly recommended that Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons bring their own supply of hand sanitiser for use in accordance with government recommendations in addition to hand sanitiser that is supplied by the Club.
5.	HYGIENE – NON-SHARING OF EQUIPMENT
5.1	The sharing of any equipment including but not limited to: tools, apparel, safety equipment, pens is not permitted unless in accordance with Appendix 4 of the 2021 Karting Australia Manual.

3.	KART RETRIEVAL
3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys Will Not be given access to the Circuit during Practice and Racing.
3.2.	Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course
3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST on the upper torso.

3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the Outgrid or as directed by the Clerk of the Course
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.
4.3.	No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards, bicycles and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.

The Doug Liddle Story.

Doug Liddle was a foundation member of the Barossa Go Kart Club when karting was in its infancy in Australia.

On land (later being called “Robinson Park”), acquired for the club by Kirby Robinson, Doug Liddle helped clear the two-hectare block to build the first of several racing layouts used.

Such was Doug’s enthusiasm for the new sport of go karting, he and his family raced on the dirt tracks on Saturday and bitumen circuits on Sunday.

Not content with his efforts as a key member of the Barossa Go Kart Club, Doug became active on the Karting State Council and represented South Australia on the National Karting Council.

Doug’s tireless efforts were recognized by the Australian Karting Association with a life membership of that organization, to add to the Life Membership of our Barossa Go Kart Club.

For Doug, karting was a family affair with wife Brenda, daughter Heather and son in law Arthur being recognized for their continuing efforts with life membership of the club.

When racing was no longer possible Doug kept a strong interest in the club holding office on the committee until his passing in 1994.

The Doug Liddle Memorial Trophy has been a highlight on the calendar for more than 20 years with the state’s top competitors’ names adorning the trophy. Among the winner are names such as Stuart Morrison.....

This year the Doug Liddle Trophy is back, this time for KA3 Senior Light drivers, the nearest equivalent of the original Clubman Medium / Heavy.
